Recently, file sharing giant WeTransfer launched a new project profiling lesser-known, emerging places that are fast becoming creative meccas, the **Creative Hubs Index**. Remarkably, **Norfolk** took one of the top three spots, with the NEON District called out for its contribution to the creative culture in the city. Among other Norfolk talents, the Index recognized local businesses Cardinal Skate Shop and Tender Heart Tattoo, NEON muralist Navid Rahman, NEON contributor Charles Rasputin, and design force Sway Creative Labs – all mainstays in keeping the district full of energy.

The icing on the cake is with recognition, comes opportunity. WeTransfer is offering a **grant program** to creative nonprofits who are bettering their community. Events, activities, or projects that relate to furthering arts, culture or creativity and supports an underrepresented group in the creative field are all eligible for \$5,000 to \$10,000 grants. ## **Call for Muralists**

It's that time NEON friends! After a couple of years away from making murals, the district is proud to present **two new opportunities** for big art on walls this summer. One is a familiar site, the rear of Bob's billboard that rotates designs every two years, and one is newly available, the backside of neighborhood spot Ghent Grab & Go. Both locations serve as entry points into the NEON, one on the east side and one on the west.

The call for artists is open to anyone, although experience with a lift and painting brick is a plus. Accepting applications now until Sunday, June 26 at 11:59pm.
