


February 2022 Newsletter

Shine a Light, the second annual exhibition juried by the NEON District Public Art Committee, opens to the public Friday, March 4. Seventeen artists of all ages and backgrounds, working in a range of media, are featured in the exhibition, which will be on view at Commune NFK March 4 to April 17.

While the inaugural NEON exhibition at Commune NFK, *Homegrown*, focused on the personal and private ways artists move through the world, *Shine a Light* creates a forum for artists to shed light on external issues that are affecting their communities. The featured artists used their art to investigate racial and gender inequality, houselessness, mental health, police brutality, environmental concerns, the opioid epidemic, the COVID-19 pandemic, and religious freedom.

Join NEON on Friday, March 4, from 6 to 9pm at Commune NFK for *Shine a Light*'s opening celebration with small plates, craft cocktails and music from The Governor's School for the Arts Jazz Band. At 7pm exhibition judge Mark Matel will announce prizes for first, second and third place, as well as a judge's award. During the six-week exhibition run, the NEON District will host several community-led events with the featured artists, neighborhood partners and local groups to highlight the socially conscious themes found in the show:

- March 18, 6-9pm Open Mic Poetry Night with ODU's Writers in Community and local writers and performers
- March 31, 5-8pm The Art of Networking II, an artist meet-up with casual 3-minute chats hosted by experienced art professionals
- April 13, 4-6pm People First's Worth It Wednesday program with Teens with a Purpose performing OTU: The Healing Quilt
- April 17, 10-4pm Closing Brunch with a community listening event hosted by Heard Productions
